JAMES COX comes from Hastings. He is 16 years old. Concerning him an officer in the army wrote me: "I am writing on behalf of a destitute lad who goes about with newspapers. He lives as best as he can in a wretched lodging, for which he has to pay all the pittance he can make by selling papers. The lad's story is pitiful in the extreme."



Investigation showed that his parents had had a bad record, the unfortunate father having, after a career of dissipation, perished by his own hand, and the mother's subsequent career being openly shameful.

The boy was cast adrift, and left to shift as best he might upon the streets and by the streets. Another lad, a brother of James, also living upon the streets, has been a wanderer for some years. Both boys, however, have apparently kept honest, and thus surmounted the temptations of their career and surroundings.

THE FLOWER AND DEAN STREET Shelter has been the means of rescuing permanently 17 little children, and the Dock Street shelter 42, or a total of 59 homeless waifs. In addition, 165 fallen girls were rescued from the life of the streets through the Flower and Dean Street Shelter, and 200 through the Dock Street Shelter, making a total of 365 unhappy young women and girls taken, as I have said, from evil lives!
